SECTION 1: ATTENDANCE

WORKING TOGETHER TO IMPROVE SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

- Good attendance at school is essential for children to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing and wider life chances.
- Nurseries and First Schools play a vital role in embedding good attendance habits.
- Even at First School, children with the highest attainment have higher rates of attendance.
- National data shows us that children not meeting the expected standard in reading, writing and maths had an overall absence rate of 4.7% (so their overall attendance was 95.3%).
- The overall absence rate of children not meeting the expected standard was higher than among those meeting the higher standard (4.7% compared to 2.7%).
- For the most vulnerable pupils, regular attendance is also an important protective factor and the best opportunity for needs to be identified and support provided.
- Research has shown there are clear links between regular absence from school and harm for children (90% of young offenders have been persistently absent as young children) and serious violence (83% of knife possession offenders had been persistently absent for at least one year).

Improving school attendance is everyone's business. Please support us in promoting the benefits of good attendance with your child - not only for their education but, also, to support their wellbeing and future life chances. Thank you.

As you know, there is no entitlement in law to time off in term time. Children who are absent from school fall behind in their learning, they miss school events and many find it difficult to catch up. In addition, school staff have to divert their attention away from other children in order to support those that have fallen behind due to a holiday related absence.

For this reason, any request for leave of absence due to holidays in term time will not be authorised. In the case of all unauthorised leave of absences, incurring 8 or more unauthorised sessions (4 days), an application for a Fixed Penalty Notice will be made to the Local Authority.

NURSERY SESSIONS

As you know, we offer 15 hour places (2.5 days) and 30 hour places (5 days) in our Nursery. In the past, we have allowed families to purchase extra sessions to "top up" their 15 hours. As there is a strict ratio of adults: children in Nursery so we have made the decision, from September 2024, we will no longer be allowing families to do this. I'm sure parents and carers will

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understand that offering partial allocation means we do not have the full 15/30 hour places to offer other children. There will still be an option for families to "top up" to the full 30 hours (purchasing the extra 2.5 days) but not to purchase ad hoc sessions.

NON-UNIFORM EVENTS

Over the course of the last few weeks, children have worn their home clothes to school for various events. Could I politely request that clothing worn for school is modest and age appropriate (e.g. skirts are an appropriate length, shoes are flat with a closed toe and are appropriate for outdoor play/PE and clothing covers children's



tummies). A sensible rule to go by is that we should not be able to see up it, down it or through it, please! Although we talk to children about why we are wearing non-uniform on these themed days, the majority of the school day is usual timetabled activities and therefore children need to be dressed appropriately. Thank you for your understanding and support in this matter.
