Daft As A Brush

Daft As A Brush is the charity adopted by Gosforth Schools' Trust as a focus for fundraising. This morning three representatives of the charity came to talk to Key Stages 1 & 2 about their work. The children were already quite knowledgeable and asked lots of pertinent questions. As part of their recent topic on Spain Key Stage 2 took on the Virgin Money Make £5 Grow challenge, a fun, free enterprise programme that engages



pupils in core areas of the National Curriculum. The children raised £244 profit from the challenge which they decide to donate to Daft As A Brush. Our visitors were delighted to be presented with a cheque this morning.

The Big Pedal



The Big Pedal is the UK's largest inter-school cycling and scooting challenge that inspires pupils, staff and parents to choose two wheels for their journey to school. Powered by Sustrans and funded by the Bike Hub, the 2017 challenge will run from 20 to 31 March and is open to everyone.

On each day of the challenge schools compete to see who can record the greatest number of pupils, staff and parents cycling or scooting to school. A school's best five days will

determine their final position, but they can log journeys on all ten days if they wish.

Please help us take part in the challenge by cycling or scooting to school. Parking further away from school and scooting or cycling the rest of the way also counts! Each class will count up each day the number of child, parent or staff journeys to school.

All schools will be entered into daily prize draws for rewards including bike and scooter stunt shows, equipment and storage if over 15% of the school cycle or scoot on each day of the challenge!
