SECTION 1: ATTENDANCE

The Local Authority has issued an updated Attendance Policy which our school has adopted. Please see the policy (attached). You can also find this on our school website.



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Attendance continues to be an area for development at our school.

The updated procedure will be as follows:

- 1. If a child's attendance falls below 96%, initial contact will be made with parents and carers (usually by the class teacher).
- 2. If further absences occur and attendance is below 94%, a letter will be sent to parents/carers and all absences without medical evidence will be unauthorised.
- 3. If attendance continues to fall, and no medical evidence is provided, absence will be unauthorised
- 4. Parents/carers will be invited to enter an Attendance Contract.
- 5. If further absences occur, a referral will be made to the Local Authority.

WORKING TOGETHER TO IMPROVE SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

• Good attendance at school is essential for children to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing and wider life chances.

- Nurseries and First Schools play a vital role in embedding good attendance habits.
- Even at First School, children with the highest attainment have higher rates of attendance compared to those with the lowest attainment.
- National data shows us that children not meeting the expected standard in reading, writing and maths had an overall absence rate of 4.7% (so overall attendance was 95.3%).
- The overall absence rate of children not meeting the expected standard was higher than among those meeting the higher standard (4.7% compared to 2.7%).
- For the most vulnerable pupils, regular attendance is also an important protective factor and the best opportunity for needs to be identified and support provided.
- Research has shown there are clear links between regular absence from school and harm for children (90% of young offenders have been persistently absent as young children) and serious violence (83% of knife possession offenders had been persistently absent for at least one year).

Improving school attendance is everyone's business. Please support us in promoting the benefits of good attendance with your child - not only for their education but, also, to support their wellbeing and future life chances. Thank you.

We will now be taking appropriate legal action for children who are deemed persistent absentees (under 90% attendance). Please see the attendance policy on our school website for further information.

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#### **PARKING**

I have, once again, been contacted by some local residents. Please do not park in front of garages and driveways while you drop off/pick up your child(ren). Residents have the right to access their home at all times of the day. Thank you for your cooperation.

Please do not park immediately outside the main school gates. This area is painted with yellow zig-zag lines which means parking is prohibited. No vehicles should park on the zigzag or even stop to set down passengers in this area. This is for the safety of your children as, in an emergency, this gate will need to be accessible for emergency vehicle access. Thank

The council are planning to install cameras and additional road markings in this area.

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#### UNIFORM POLICY

A reminder that our school uniform is for children in Nursery — Year 4. This includes:

- Yellow Polo Shirt either completely plain or with school logo
- Royal blue round neck sweatshirt or cardigan either completely plain or with school logo
- Plain grey or black trousers, shorts, skirts, pinafores.
- During the Summer Term, blue or yellow gingham dresses may be worn
- Sensible fitting smart <u>black shoes</u>, (not trainers) or boots. Shoes with a heel are not permitted. These should be suitable for outdoor play and running and should <u>not have open toes</u>.
- Plain grey, black or white tights or socks (not leggings please).



All children need to bring a book bag to school (not a rucksack please). Thank you.

#### PE Kit

- Plain yellow T-shirt
- Royal blue, plain shorts and/or navy tracksuit bottoms
- Navy hoodie, sweatshirt or zip-through top either completely plain or with school logo
- Well-fitting trainers that children can fasten themselves (not plimsolls). We ask families to not send children with lace up shoes if they cannot tie their own laces, please.

Children in Nursery and Reception bring PE kits to keep in school. Families are asked to bring drawstring bag in which to store their PE kits. Thank you.

Year 4 children are asked to bring uniform and school shoes to change into after their PE lesson, please.

#### Jewellery

- Small wrist watches may be worn (smart watches that record sound or images are not allowed); however these must be removed for PE.
- No other jewellery may be worn for school, including stud earrings.

Please remove earrings before school. Current guidance is not to cover stud earrings with plasters. If a child can't take their earrings out, they will need to take the role of an observer within PE lessons.

#### Hairstyles

- Long hair (below collar length) should be tied back, please.
- No extreme hairstyles e.g. vivid coloured hair as this serves as a distraction to themselves and others and sets the pupil out as being different, which can lead to problems with behaviour and discipline amongst the children.



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The Headteacher has the final say in deciding what is acceptable so, when in doubt, parents should consult with her before buying items which might not be acceptable or if in doubt about hair style.
