

Next Monday and Tuesday, all classes will be involved in Forest School activities. Payments have already been set up on ParentMail. Forest School sessions will be led by Anna Gray, who is a qualified Forest School Leader, and supported by staff in school.

Forest School is a method of outdoor education that allows children to develop confidence, independence, self-esteem as well as awareness and knowledge of the natural environment. They acquire this through hands on experiences in outdoor and woodland environments. There is much evidence to demonstrate that learning taking place outdoors, and whilst being active, is much more powerful and memorable, as all the senses are involved. During Forest School sessions children work in a nurturing environment where they are encouraged to try new things and work outside of their comfort zone. Aspirational language is always used and all tasks are achievable; enabling children to build self- esteem and develop confidence to push themselves.

The Forest School concept originates in Denmark where it was found that children, who attended Forest School from a young age, arrived at school with strong social and communication skills, having the ability to work in groups effectively. They generally had high self-esteem and a confidence in their own abilities. This foundation helped them to raise their academic achievements.

Children will need to wear comfortable trousers and long sleeved tops. Forest school activities happen regardless of the weather so please ensure children are dressed appropriately (waterproof suits and wellies if wet and sunhats if bright).

STAFFING

After a very rigorous selection process, we are delighted to announce that we have appointed Charlotte Orr to join our teaching staff team in September. Miss Orr will be spending time in school between now and July to get to know children and staff.

We were delighted with the quantity of applications received and the fantastic feedback from the candidates about our school.

STEM CHALLENGE 3: Make your own lava lamp

You will need

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- · A clean 1 litre plastic bottle
- \cdot 3/4 glass of water
- · Vegetable Oil
- · Fizzy tablets (e.g. vitamin c fizz)
- · Food colouring

What to do

- Pour the water into the bottle.
- · Use a measuring cup or funnel to slowly pour the vegetable oil into the bottle until it's almost full. You may have to wait a few minutes for the oil and water separate.
- · Add 10 drops of food colouring to the bottom.
- Drop a fizzy tablet into the bottle.
- · Watch your lava lamp come alive! To really add an effect, turn off the lights and shine a torch through the bottom of the bottle.

How it works and questions to ask your child

The oil stays above the water because the oil is lighter than the water. When you added the tablet, it sank to the bottom and started dissolving and creating a gas. As the gas bubbles rose, they took some of the coloured water with them. When the blob of water reached the top, the gas escaped and down went the water.

- 1. Does the temperature of the water affect the reaction?
- 2. Does the size of the bottle affect how many blobs are produced?
- 3. Does the effect still work if the cap is put on the bottle?
- 4. Does the effect still work if the cap is put on the bottle?
