We are reading:

In English, we will be developing our reading skills by using prediction, inference and sequencing the story. We will look at vocabulary choices and discuss how they have been used in the stories. We will be improving our writing by continuing to focus on quality over quantity – remembering all our sentence 'non- negotiables' (capital letters, finger spaces, full stops). Our handwriting focus will be practising our handwriting using diagonals joins. Our grammar, punctuation and spelling focus is using different sentence types and adjectives.

In Maths, we will develop our knowledge of place value up to 100 as well as learning to tell the time and use positional language. We will also begin to look at money and recognising coins. This will include: Identifying and representing numbers using objects and pictorial representations including the number line, and use the language of equal to, more than, less than (fewer), most and least. Telling the time to the hour and half past the hour and drawing the hands on a clock face to show these times.

Times table focus: 2s, 5s and 10s Key vocabulary: pounds, pence, hours, minutes, seconds

In Science, we are learning about and exploring parts of a tree and different types of trees. We will be finding the difference between evergreen and deciduous trees and linking this to seasonal change. We will be working scientifically by asking scientific questions and make observations.

Our scientist of the term is: Bill Nye Key vocabulary: evergreen, deciduous, trunk, branches

In PE this half term, we will be focusing on their athletics skills such as running, jumping and throwing. They will be then using these skills in the Year 1 sports day.

We will be learning about the impact of how these places of worship are holy places are not just for believers but how they serve the wider community. We will be making connections between different religions and non-religions, such as Christianity, Judaism and Islam.

Key vocabulary: church, synagogue, mosque, sacred, respect

In History, we will be exploring Gosforth and will be learning about chronology and looking at the changes that have happened over time as well as understanding why these changes have happened. We will be going on a walking tour of Gosforth.

Key vocabulary: changed because..., evidence, chronological

In Computing, we will be using the school laptops to explore PowerPoint and using it to create a presentation about how Gosforth has changed over time, linking to our history unit.

Key vocabulary: slides, files, JPEGs

In Music, we will continue to be working with Newcastle Music Service on Djembe drumming, focussing on our performance skills. We are then looking forward to performing these skills in our school music concert!

Key vocabulary: beat, tempo, tone, bass

In PSHE we will be about 'What helps us stay healthy?'. This will have a particular focus on a healthy lifestyle, understanding how people help us to stay healthy and what we can do to keep ourselves healthy. We will make links to our previous DT lessons about healthy eating.

Key vocabulary: health, healthy eating, physical activity
