WORKING TOGETHER TO IMPROVE SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

- Good attendance at school is essential for children to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing and wider life chances.
- Nurseries and First Schools play a vital role in embedding good attendance habits.
- Even at First School, children with the highest attainment have higher rates of attendance compared to those with the lowest attainment.
- National data shows us that children not meeting the expected standard in reading, writing and maths had an overall absence rate of 4.7% (so overall attendance was 95.3%).
- The overall absence rate of children not meeting the expected standard was higher than among those meeting the higher standard (4.7% compared to 2.7%).
- For the most vulnerable pupils, regular attendance is also an important protective factor and the best opportunity for needs to be identified and support provided.
- Research has shown there are clear links between regular absence from school and harm for children (90% of young offenders have been persistently absent as young children) and serious violence (83% of knife possession offenders had been persistently absent for at least one year).

Improving school attendance is everyone's business. Please support us in promoting the benefits of good attendance with your child, not only for their education, but also to support their wellbeing and future life chances. Thank you.

WRAPAROUND BOOKINGS

In response to parental feedback, from September 2023 we will be outsourcing the booking, payment & administration of our breakfast & after school club to Childcare Bookings for Schools.



Childcare Bookings support schools running their own wraparound childcare by dealing with all bookings and the associated administration. They are experts in this field, with over 15 years' experience in the management of childcare.

All aspects of booking, payment & administration can be made, including:

• 24/7 access to a bespoke online booking system, tailored to our school, which provides;

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- Independent access for parents to make bookings, update details, or download financial statements, with;
- Further phone or email support available from 9am 5pm, Monday to Friday, all year round.

For any queries related to the on-site running of the club itself (e.g. food, activities, welfare, or lost property) your point of contact will remain wraparound@archbishop.newcastle.sch.uk.

We will be in contact again later in the term to provide full information on how and when you will be able to start booking online.

NEMCo MUSIC TUITION

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NEMCo have now confirmed that they can offer guitar lessons to children in Year 3 & 4 from September.
