AFTER SCHOOL CLUB

COVID UPDATE

Due to the continued high infection rate locally, Newcastle's Covid Control Group has recommended additional precautionary action be taken by those identified as a close contact of someone who has tested positive for COVID-19.

- Anyone who is identified as a close contact of a confirmed case, are • advised to get a PCR test as soon as possible.
- If negative, they should take a further precautionary approach, by undertaking daily LFD testing for 10 days after their last contact with the positive case.





NATIVITY

As you will know, due to the current local case numbers of covid, we are not yet able to welcome families back into school at Christmas. However, we are very excited that Julian from GEM Education, who are our Computing consultants, will be recording the Nativities this year! Parents of last year's Year 4 will recognise Julian's work as he produced the absolutely fantastic leavers video that was very well-received!

The performances will be completed in Key Stages (i.e. Nursery and Reception together, Years 1 and 2 together, Years 3 and 4 together) and their full performances will be shared with families, just like the Year 4 video was, via a Google Drive link requiring a password. The link will be time restricted for a certain number of days for families to download if they wish. The video link will then be removed after this time.

Next week, you will receive a ParentMail form asking you for your permission for this videoing. It is essential that this is completed in order for your child to be included in the recorded production (although, they can still take part in rehearsals). Thank you.

SMART WATCHES

It has been brought to my attention that some children are wearing 'smart watches' into school. We ask for these not to be brought into school. They could be lost or damaged easily, distract children from their learning and, most importantly of all, could be a safeguarding risk due to the way that some watches can phone other devices and record video and/or sound(s). If any smart watches are found in school, they will be given to staff and returned to families at the end of the day. Thank you for your understanding in this matter.

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NEWCASTLE CITY COUNCIL CATERING ASSISTANTS AND **CLEANING ROLES**



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Are you looking for a job which helps you earn money and still be able to look after your children?

Newcastle City Council have opportunities for you to work in schools across Newcastle. Newcastle City Council value their staff and we pay an hourly rate of £9.90, this includes the Newcastle Living Wage.

Catering Assistant roles are term time only so you work 39 weeks during term time so you don't have to think about child care during the school holidays. The Catering Assistant roles vary from 10 to 20 hours per week. There are career progression opportunities too, many of our Catering Assistants have moved to Assistant Chef posts then to Chef posts and on to Management roles.

Cleaner roles are either 39 or 52 week contracts and range in hours from 10 to 30 hours per week. The cleaning roles are either early morning or late afternoon in schools and we have opportunities in our public buildings too. There are also career opportunities here too, many of our Cleaners move to Chargehand Cleaner or Caretaker roles and on to Management roles.

CHRISTMAS HAMPER RAFFLE


