SECTION 1: ATTENDANCE

WORKING TOGETHER TO IMPROVE SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

- Good attendance at school is essential for children to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing and wider life chances.
- Nurseries and First Schools play a vital role in embedding good attendance habits.
- Even at First School, children with the highest attainment have higher rates of attendance.
- National data shows us that children not meeting the expected standard in reading, writing and • maths had an overall absence rate of 4.7% (so their overall attendance was 95.3%).
- The overall absence rate of children not meeting the expected standard was higher than among • those meeting the higher standard (4.7% compared to 2.7%).
- For the most vulnerable pupils, regular attendance is also an important protective factor and the • best opportunity for needs to be identified and support provided.
- Research has shown there are clear links between regular absence from school and harm for children (90% of young offenders have been persistently absent as young children) and serious violence (83% of knife possession offenders had been persistently absent for at least one year).

Improving school attendance is everyone's business. Please support us in promoting the benefits of good attendance with your child - not only for their education but, also, to support their wellbeing and future life chances. Thank you.

As you know, there is no entitlement in law to time off in term time. Children who are absent from school fall behind in their learning, they miss school events and many find it difficult to catch up. In addition, school staff have to divert their attention away from other children in order to support those that have fallen behind due to a holiday related absence.

As you may already be aware, there is a new Attendance Policy due to come into effect in September. We will, of course, share this with you in due course but, in summary:

- Parent Contracts will be replaced with Attendance Contracts
- Monitoring letters will be replaced with Notice to Improve letters
- There will be new register codes (all holidays will be unauthorised) •
- There will be a stepped approach to Fixed Penalty Notices (1st offence £160, reduced to £80 if paid within 21 days, 2nd offence - with no reduction for early repayment, 3rd offence – referral to court) over a 3 year period.

COLLECTIVE WORSHIP

Last week, we reflected on protected characteristics as well as staying physically and mentally healthy. It was interesting to think about the overlap between the two.



We have also thought about transition and how to cope with changes; asking God for courage when we need it. NON-UNIFORM EVENTS

Over the course of the last few weeks, children have worn their home clothes to school for various events. Could I politely request that clothing worn for school is modest and age appropriate (e.g. shorts and skirts are an appropriate length, shoes are flat with a closed toe and are appropriate for outdoor play/PE and clothing

covers children's tummies). A sensible rule to go by is that we should not be able to see up it, down it or through it, please! Although we talk to children about why we are wearing non-uniform on these themed days, the majority of the school day is usual timetabled activities and therefore children need to be dressed appropriately. Thank you for your understanding and support in this matter.



YEAR 3 SLEEPOVER

The Year 3 children had a wonderful two-day event in school, last week. I'm sure you spotted the huge inflatable obstacle course, archery targets and water fight (amongst other things!) that were set up on the school field! Huge thanks to the staff who stayed late, arrived early or slept over in order to make this possible for our children. The Year 3 children were amazing and showed determination in the face of new challenges whilst having lots of fun! It really was a fabulous event.

TRANSITION

Hopefully your child has come home excited about their visit to their new class (or school) this week. Children have spent 2 days with their new teacher, in their new classroom and trying out their new routines. They all rose spectacularly to the challenge!

Meet the teachers meetings are happening, after school, for parents of children who are currently in Reception – Year 3 over the last couple of weeks. As part of our end of year celebrations, on Tuesday 16th July, all children in school are going to Tynemouth Beach. We will travel on coaches and, once at the beach, spend the day playing and paddling! Please keep your fingers crossed for sunshine!





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PRE-LOVED

UMIFORMS



Children are invited to come to school in swimwear (so that they do not need to change on the beach) covered with a hoodie and shorts. They should each bring a small backpack containing:

• a named towel

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- a named change of clothes
- a named packed lunch we can provide these for children who usually have a school lunch (please indicate this on ParentMail).
- a named bucket and spade

If children have dry robes these would also be ideal!

Children must all have long lasting sun cream applied <u>before arriving at school</u> and appropriate (named!) clothing for the weather e.g. coats if cold, sunhat if warm.

All staff will be going to the beach too (along with some regular helpers in school) so children will be well supervised. We will have a designated area in which to play on the sand and, if they wish, children will be able to paddle (to ankle depth) in small groups. We have asked children to arrive already in swimwear (under their clothes) so that they only need to get fully changed at the end of the day. Swimwear dries quicker than clothing so, if children get wet, they will not be uncomfortable.

We are really excited to be able to offer your children this opportunity and hope it will be day to remember (it may even become an annual event!).

UNIFORM UPDATE

From September, only children in Years 2, 3 and 4 will wear the navy PE uniform. Children in Year 1 will still come to school in PE kit, but this will consist of the usual yellow polo shirt and blue school jumper rather than the navy hoodie along with navy joggers or royal blue shorts. Eventually, the aim is to phase out the navy PE kit in order to reduce costs to parents by only requiring one uniform for the full week.

Additionally, a reminder that children should wear **black school shoes** or trainers. Please do not send children in multi-coloured footwear or sandals/flip-flops. Thank you.

Similarly, for forest school, children will continue to wear yellow polo shirt and blue school jumper rather than the navy hoodie along with navy joggers and bring named wellies in a bag (not to wear all day).

Please remember that we have a pre-loved uniform library in the main entrance for anyone who would like to buy/swap/borrow items.



INCOME BASED FREE SCHOOL MEALS

We can confirm that the LA can fund vouchers this coming summer holiday at $\pounds 15$ per week for eligible pupils. This includes those who are leaving our school and it includes those that may be attending the Holiday Activity Fund programme. This does not include pupils who are due to start our school in September. Mrs Lowe will issue theses in due course.

As you are already aware, there was an incident, earlier this week, where a child from GCMS was injured whilst riding their bike due to a car door being opened into the road. 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
