Questions 1, 4 and 7 (Reasoning)

Developing Explain whether an apostrophe has been used correctly to show possession with a regular plural noun (ending in 's').

Expected Explain whether an apostrophe has been used correctly to show possession with an irregular plural noun (does not end in 's').

Greater Depth Explain whether an apostrophe has been used correctly to show possession with a collective noun.

Questions 2, 5 and 8 (Application)

Developing Change a noun from singular to a regular plural in a sentence using an apostrophe to show possession.

Expected Change a noun from singular to an irregular plural in a sentence using an apostrophe to show possession.

Greater Depth Change a collective noun in a sentence using an apostrophe to show possession.

Questions 3, 6 and 9 (Application)

Developing Use a word bank to write a sentence using an apostrophe to show possession with a regular plural noun (ending in 's').

Expected Use a word bank to write a sentence using an apostrophe to show possession with an irregular plural noun (does not end in 's').

Greater Depth Write a sentence using a given collective noun and an apostrophe to show possession. No word bank given.

1a. No, it should be girls'. The plural already ends in s, so only an apostrophe is added.

4a. No, it should be 'women's'. The plural doesn't end in s, so an apostrophe is added, followed by an s.

Greater Depth

7a. No, it should be flock's. The plural doesn't end in s, so an apostrophe is added, followed by an s.

8a. pride's

9a. Example answer: The school's smallest fish were usually the fastest swimmers.

4b. No, it should be teeth's. The plural doesn't end in s, so an apostrophe is added, followed by an s.

6b. The men's toilet was closed today.

Greater Depth

7b. No, it should be unkindness's. An apostrophe followed by an s is needed here as the last s is pronounced.

9b. Example answer: The coven's wicked spell put the unsuspecting town to sleep.
