

Physical Development

Children will be developing a range of skills in multi-skills sessions. They will improve their agility, balance and co-ordination through individual and team challenges.

Children will continue to improve their handwriting skills including writing lower and upper case letters.

Exploring and using media and materials

Children will explore a range of 8 media and materials to create winter themed art. We will be creating 3D sculptures with ice and snow and be designing and making dens for a polar exploration. Children will explore light and dark

Understanding the world

Children will investigate a range of scientific concepts including freezing and melting. We will investigate weather and learn about different climates. We will be finding out about Polar animals and the Poles.

Spring Term One Reception

Topic: Winter

Literacy

Children will be looking at a range of stories with a Winter theme including Snow Bear and Jack Frost. The children will describe characters from these and retell the stories. We will use a range of non-fiction texts to investigate weather and Polar animals. Children will learn how to write lists for our Polar exploration



Being imaginative

Children will become Polar explorers as we search for the Northern Lights with the Snow Bear. We will set up a camp to develop role play around the Snow Bear story.

Mathematics

Children will be learning about early addition skills through practical activities and problem solving. They will continue to order and write numbers 1-20 and find missing numbers and patterns.

We will be learning about data handling linked to our weather topic.
