SWIMMING LESSONS

Swimming is part of the PE curriculum in KS2. The national curriculum expectation is for children to swim 25 metres by the end of KS2 (Year 6).



Therefore, Years 3 and 4 non-swimmers will attend swimming lessons after Easter. This is only for children who cannot yet swim 25 metres. We would be grateful if parents of children in KS2 could let us know the swimming capabilities of their child, via ParentMail (form to follow), so we can make appropriate arrangements. If children can already swim 25 metres they will receive alternative PE provision in school.

PACKED LUNCHES

As you know, we are an accredited "Healthy School". Please remember no sweets, chocolate bars or fizzy drinks in packed lunches! We really appreciate your cooperation and support in keeping lunch boxes healthy. It is really important that the children on packed lunches bring something filling such as sandwich or pasta (or other carbohydrates) that will fill them up for the afternoon rather than just crisps and other processed snacks.



SCHOOL LUNCHES

Please remember the kitchen requires 2 weeks notice if you intend to change from school dinners to packed lunch (or vice versa). Mrs McCloud will provide you with a form to complete in this event. School dinners are $\pounds 2.00$ per meal for Years 3 & 4 ($\pounds 1.90$ for Nursery). The amount payable for schools meals next half term is $\pounds 58$ (for Years 3 and 4 taking into account the Seven Stories trip if your child is bringing their own

packed lunch), £22.80 for nursery children who stay for lunch two days were week and £57 for full time children.
