Ms Lowe sent a ParentMail a few weeks ago to assess the demand for extending After School Club hours in order to find out how many families would be interested in using the extend hours.



FUNDAMENTAL BRITISH VALUES

In Worship, we have been exploring Fundamental British Values. These are statutory duties that all schools must uphold but that we celebrate in ARFS. They are also linked to the protected characteristics from the Equality Act 2010.



Over the past fortnight, we have looked at:



- Democracy, including how we in school have our School Council and Worship Council to represent children's views. A special well done to the Year 4 children who could name our local MP, Catherine McKinnell, who of course visited us not long ago!
- The rule of law, including why rules are important to keep us all safe and how they apply to everyone.
- Individual liberty, which is about how we are free too be who we want to be. We read the lovely book Perfectly Norman to remind us that we are all special and unique and that we should celebrate our differences and individuality, not hide them/it.

Ask your children if they can remember our handy (!) way of remembering it (above). We'll be exploring our last two 'fingers', mutual respect and understanding of different religions, in the coming week.

WORSHIP

We have, this week in Worship, been thinking about Advent, including lighting our first purple candle. We discussed how Advent is a special time for Christians and how Advent is Latin for 'coming', helping us prepare for what is to come in the next few weeks. We thought about how the colour purple represents hope and Mr Booth even showed his own advent calendar, demonstrating no one is too old to get excited during Advent!



NATIVITY



You should, by now, have received a letter from class teachers requesting costumes for our nativities. We would be really grateful if these could be in school by next Monday please (6th December).
