

Literacy

You could try;

- listening to the stories 'The Train Ride' and 'Penguin on Holiday'.
- writing a postcard to the little girl from the Train Ride story.
- blending sounds together to hear words.
- beginning to recognise the sounds s,a,t,p,i,n.

Mathematics

You could try;

- cutting out pictures of different modes of transport and categorising them into a chart under the headings, air, land, sea.
- racing cars down various slopes and measure the distance they travel.
- playing ordering, matching and counting games with numbers 0-10.

Understanding the World

You could try;

- making paper planes and boats and see how they fly or sail.
- pretend to go on a journey, Make a passport and tickets.
- talking about the differences between the town, the county and the seaside.

Expressive Arts and Design

You could try;

- singing songs and rhymes linked to transport, 'The Wheels on the Bus'.
- making some junk model vehicles.
- making a hot air balloon with a balloon and a paper cup.

- finding out and exploring.
- willing to have a go.
- playing with what I know.
- being involved and concentrating.

Religious Education

You could try;

- reading the story of Noah's Ark. Can you make an ark and place in your animals in pairs?

Visits and Visitors

You could try;

- to see how many different modes of transport you can spot whilst out for a walk.

- talking about journeys you have been on. Where did you go? How did you get there?
- talking about road safety and how to stay safe on the roads.
- discussing if you had an aeroplane, where would you go and why?
- discussing the journey to Reception.

You could try;

- looking at pictures from the story to look at prepositions, in front, behind, under, over, through.
- talking about different modes of transport. When/why would you use them?
- talking about vehicles that help us.
- reading stories about travelling and transport.

You could try;

- building bridges and roads for transport to move along.
- folding origami boats and floating them in some water.
- practising road safety with a grown up whilst on a walk.
- copying all of the letters from your name.
