Did you know ...?

WORKING TOGETHER TO IMPROVE SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

- Good attendance at school is essential for children to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing and wider life chances.
- Nurseries and first schools play a vital role in embedding good attendance habits.
- Even at first school, children with the highest attendance have higher rates of attainment.
- National data shows us that children not meeting the expected standard in reading, writing and maths.
- For the most vulnerable pupils, regular attendance is also an important protective factor and the best opportunity for children's needs to be identified and support provided.

Research has shown there are clear links between regular absence from school and harm to children.

- 95% attendance = two weeks absence
- · 90% attendance = 4 weeks absence
- · 85% attendance = 6 weeks absence
- · 80% attendance = more than half a term of absence
- · 75% attendance = more than 9 weeks of absence

Please remember that I am unable to authorise absences during term time for family holidays. We would be grateful if parents/carers could also inform grandparents, family and friends, who may be looking to book birthday or Christmas trips away, that these do not fall under exceptional circumstances and will not be authorised.

If you need any support regarding attendance, please do not hesitate to come and speak to us as we can help you access support from the school nurse, attendance officer or other appropriate services.

We recognise that children may sometimes have a legitimate reason to be absent from school, and we are also aware that some families face difficulties which may impact on their child's education, therefore, the traffic light system has been put in place to support families by highlighting concerns at an early stage.

We hope that you will continue to support our school by promoting school attendance and by informing us if you feel there are any issues that are preventing your child from attending school regularly.






Church Links

MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS

As you know, last Friday our children and staff wore green for World Mental Health day 2025. We used the opportunity to raise awareness of Mental Health throughout the day.

Ways you can support your child at home

- Build positive routines healthy eating, exercise and sleep routines are so important.
- Be there to listen regularly ask children how they're doing, encourage them to talk about their feelings and to know there's always someone to listen.
- Try to help your child(ren) to understand how they're feeling (naming the emotions they are experiencing) and why.
- Encourage practical interests being active, creative, learning new things and being part of a team can all be helpful.

Signs a child may be struggling

- Wanting to stay at home/indoors or with parents/carers all the time
- Sleeping problems
- Negative thoughts and low self-esteem
- Increased arguing and fighting
- Unexplained physical changes, such as weight loss or gain

Support in school

- At ARFS, we place a huge emphasis on relationships so that children know they can approach any adult in school for help.
- Worry boxes are available in all classrooms and outside my office for anyone who doesn't want to verbalise their worries.
- We use "Colour Monsters" in Nursery & Reception and "Zones of Regulation" in Years 1 4 to support children to identify, name and describe their feelings. We also have a range of resources and interventions based on these approaches that we share with children as appropriate.
- We have staff who have undertaken additional training in mental health awareness including emotionally based school non-attendance (EBSNA).
- Newcastle LA SEMH Service attend school and work with groups of children within the school day. With parental permission, they can also work with individuals.
- Monthly School Nurse service available to all children and families.
- Children with additional needs in social, emotional or mental health can be added to our SEND register.

BOOKBAG CHARMS

Please could we request that keyrings and other charms and toys are removed from children's bookbags as they are causing a significant distraction and some poor behaviour, as well as making them difficult to store in small spaces. Some children have rather large collections (which are often noisy!) attached which can be very challenging to store in school. Whilst I understand these can help make bookbags easier to identify, it would be more helpful to have the child's initials written in sharpie on the top of the handle.

I would strongly discourage parents and carers from writing children's names on their bookbags where this can be read by strangers. This presents a safeguarding risk because it provides personal information to strangers, making it easier for them to gain a child's trust. Initials

written on handles can be covered easily in public places and, when being held, will not be visible to others.

From Monday, these will be removed and returned to parents/carers at the end of the day.

WORRIED ABOUT A CHILD?

Mrs Massey, Mrs Francis, Mrs Crozier and Mrs Ellwood are our school's Designated Safeguarding Leaders (DSLs). Mr Brown is DSL for Wraparound care. Children are regularly reminded who they can talk to if they are worried about something in school.

E-SAFETY - How to start a conversation with your child about using a phone safely:

Why do you want to get a phone?

Whilst deciding if it is time for your child to have their first phone can be a great opportunity to find out what your child expects to use their phone for. This could be for connecting with friends, playing games, for keeping in touch whilst out of the house or other reasons.

What do you like about using a phone?

You can ask your child about their favourite apps or games, what they like using their phone for, or you can ask them to show you how to play or use their favourite game or website.

What would you do if something worrying or upsetting happened on your phone?

You can ask them about the places they can go to find the safety advice, find out what they know about privacy settings, and ask them how to report or block on the services they use.

How can we do more online together?

Ask your child about activities or games that you could enjoy as a family, this can be a great time to establish a family agreement⁶ to manage your families time online.

- Talk with your child about responsible use of their phone Discuss what is okay and not okay to use their phone for. Talk about time limits and expectations of where the device can and cannot be used, this could include things like the phone being charged outside their bedroom overnight.
- **Discuss what to do if something upsetting or worrying happens** Give them the strategies they need in case something concerning happens whilst they are using their device. This could be to lock the screen and tell an adult, to make a report to the platform they are using, or to block the user.
- **Explore parental controls** Take a look at the controls available both on the phone itself and on your home Wi-Fi. Talk these through with your child too. Parental controls are a helpful tool, but an open conversation with your child is the most important thing.



SAFEGUARDING ALERT

We have been alerted to a safeguarding alert linked to some books by Andy Cope including those in the Spy Dogs, Spy Cats and Spy Pup Series.

The publisher, Puffin, has issued an alert regarding a link encouraging within the books children to find out additional information on the story. The link was intended to take children to Mr Cope's website, however this domain is no longer owned by Mr Cope and has been taken over by a third party. This third party is now publishing inappropriate adult content. The website is no longer associated with Puffin or Mr Cope. The content of the stories themselves remains completely appropriate and the website link is the issue. Children should not visit this website link.

In school, Mrs Crozier has already taken these texts off the shelves in our library. We are also checking to see whether any of these books are currently on loan. Please also check at home to see whether your child has a copy (either from school or their own). Thank you.
