## Lesson 1

## **Discussion and learning:**

Firstly, discuss what it means to give.

Use the PowerPoint and study the picture 'Julie Wohl's Tzedekah'.

- 1. Spot 10 things or more from within the picture. Write these down.
- 2. Can you make a connection between 2 items and things within your own lives?

Explain what a Tzedekah is: a Tzedekah is a Hebrew word that means 'justice' or 'charity', it tells Jewish children something important about how to live together within a community and religion. It is a box that collects tokens of charity, for example money. Share how it's important to give to people in need and that we enjoy things which people give to us. Discuss how gratitude is important and that there are things apart from money which we can give to other people.

- 3. Discuss a time when something has been given to you and when you have given somebody something. How does it feel?
- 4. What does 'giving' mean in a community?
- 5. How do we give to support the poor?
