Your child will have these sessions daily:

- English
- Maths

Maths



- Number and place value
- Addition and subtraction
- Multiplication and division practising the 2-12 times tables (Times Table Rockstars is a great app to use!)
- Length and perimeter
- Fractions
- Decimals
- Money
- Time
- Geometry (properties of shapes & position and direction)
- Statistics

English - vocabulary, grammar and punctuation

Children will learn:

- The grammatical difference between plural and possessive —s
- Standard English forms for verb inflections instead of local spoken forms [for example, we were instead of we was, or I did instead of I done] learn how to use sentences with different forms: statement, question, exclamation, command
- Noun phrases expanded by the addition of modifying adjectives, nouns and preposition phrases
- Fronted adverbials [for example, Later that day, I heard the bad news.]
- Use of paragraphs to organise ideas around a theme
- Appropriate choice of pronoun or noun within and across sentences to aid cohesion and avoid repetition
- Use of inverted commas and other punctuation to indicate direct speech
- Apostrophes to mark plural possession
- Use of commas after fronted adverbials



English – writing

Children will be taught to;

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plan their writing by:
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discussing writing similar to that which they are planning to write in order to understand and learn from its structure, vocabulary and grammar discussing and recording ideas

draft and write by:

composing and rehearsing sentences orally (including dialogue), progressively building a varied and rich vocabulary and an increasing range of sentence structures

organising paragraphs around a theme

in narratives, creating settings, characters and plot

in non-narrative material, using simple organisational devices [for example, headings and sub-headings] evaluate and edit by:

assessing the effectiveness of their own and others' writing and suggesting improvements proposing changes to grammar and vocabulary to improve consistency, including the accurate use of pronouns in sentences

proofread for spelling and punctuation errors

read their own writing aloud to a group or the whole class, using appropriate intonation and controlling the tone and volume so that the meaning is clear

The Year 4 Curriculum



English – handwriting

- Formation of capitals and lower-case letters should now be familiar and secure.
- Children have been introduced to the two basic join types:
- Joins from the baseline, known as diagonal joins
- Joins from the cross bar, known as horizontal joins
- Break letters (i.e. letters which are not joined from at this stage) include g, j and y. Letters which are never joined to or from are x and z.
- By this stage, children should be secure at joining and able to use joined up writing for most of their word.
- Opportunities will also be provided for children to practise writing at increased speed so that they can produce longer pieces of writing with greater ease.
- There is continued emphasis on using the movements of handwriting to support spelling through the revision of common letter patterns.
- Children will be introduced to the print alphabet for purposes such as captions, headings, labels and posters.



- Spellings will be sent home each Thursday and will include 5 spellings that follow a specific spelling rule and 3 spellings taken from the Year 3/4 common exception word list.
- **Spelling Shed** is a brilliant website to support spelling practise! Weekly 'assignments' are set on **Spelling Shed** that match the spelling rule taught in school during that week. There are also assignments that match the Year 3/4 common exception words.

Reading

- Children select their own reading books from the library. Reading books and reading records should be taken home each afternoon; please make a short comment each time you hear your child read. This should be daily, please.
- Whilst many children are confident readers already, reading aloud is an important skill to practise as well as sharing books and stories. To support your child's comprehension skills, you can ask them questions, discuss characters, plots and facts. Question prompts can be found in the front of your child's reading record.
- On some occasions, children may be asked to re-read a book to increase their understanding and build fluency.

Reading


- In school, all children will be listened to reading; we have our own record system.






Reading record layout

This is a statutory assessment that all year 4 pupils across the country must take.



Medication

- Homework is set, matching the learning covered in class that week, on
 IXL.com. Children can complete additional tasks to support their learning
 if they would like, they can choose from any Year 4 maths or English
 tasks.
- Easimaths is an online website that can support maths.
- Using the Spelling Shed to practise spellings.
- Using Times Table Rockstars to practise all times tables.
- Daily reading and encouraging independent reading for pleasure.
