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

COVID UPDATE

As I am sure you are aware, the government have today changed their Covid guidance. Free testing has now stopped for the majority of people, unless you are part of a specific group such as NHS staff and some eligible patients.



- Adults with the symptoms of a respiratory infection, and who have
 a high temperature or feel unwell, should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people
 until they feel well enough to resume normal activities and they no longer have a high temperature
 . This means if you have a high temperature, repeated cough etc you'd stay at home until you feel
 better. (There are no minimum days in isolation for this just until you feel better).
- Adults with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with
 other people for 5 days, which is when they are most infectious. Free PCR tests will not routinely be
 available, but we are aware some of you may still have lateral flow tests to identify positive Covid
 results

Guidance from the Department of Education for children states that:

- Respiratory infections are common in children and young people, particularly during the winter
 months. Symptoms can be caused by several respiratory infections including the common cold,
 COVID-19, flu, and respiratory syncytial virus (RSV). For most children these illnesses will not be
 serious, and they soon recover. Children with respiratory infections can experience a range of
 symptoms including a runny nose, high temperature, cough and sore throat. It is not possible to tell
 which germ someone is infected with based on symptoms alone.
- Children with <u>mild symptoms</u> such as a runny nose, sore throat, or mild cough, who are otherwise well, <u>can continue to attend</u> their education or childcare setting.
- Children and young people who are <u>unwell and have a high temperature</u> should stay at home and where possible avoid contact with other people. They can go back to education or childcare setting when they no longer have a high temperature and they are well enough.



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• If a child or young person (under the age of 18) has a positive COVID-19 test result, they should try to stay at home and where possible avoid contact with other people for 3 days after the day, they took the test. The risk of passing the infection on to others is much lower after 3 days if they feel well and do not have a high temperature.

• Children and young people who usually attend an education or childcare setting and who live with someone who has a positive COVID-19 test result should continue to attend as normal.

Should we have an outbreak of Covid cases in school, extra measures may need to be put into place. We will continue to encourage regular handwashing, ventilating rooms and 'Catch it Kill it Bin it' routines. If you have any further questions, please don't hesitate to contact me.

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READING BOOKS



We would be really grateful if all reading books could be returned to school when complete please. There are already several books missing from our new reading scheme and they are expensive to replace. Please check bookshelves and bedrooms at home for any books that might belong to school. Unfortunately, we have noticed a decline in comments about children's reading, at home, in Reading Records. Please note that books may not be changed if we do not know your child has read them. Please remember to **sign your child's reading record each time your child reads** (which should be daily please). A polite reminder that children should be re-reading their short phonics books **several times during the week** in order to develop their fluency, intonation and pace (this is not always applicable for those children reading longer books on Accelerated Reader). 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BIG WALK & WHEEL

Thank you everyone who has made an effort to travel to and from to school on foot, scooters and bikes! We are following the results of all the participating schools in Newcastle each day with anticipation...!

ILLNESS

We have had several reported cases of Chicken Pox and Scarlet Fever in school. Please read the information sent, via ParentMail, earlier in the week.

Scarlet Fever

Children can return to school 24 hours after commencing appropriate antibiotic treatment. If no antibiotics have been administered, the person will be infectious for 2 to 3 weeks.





Chicken pox (shingles)

Cases of chickenpox are generally

infectious from 2 days before the rash appears to 5 days after the onset of rash. Although the usual exclusion period is 5 days, all lesions should be crusted over before children return to nursery or school.

A person with shingles is infectious to those who have not had chickenpox and should be excluded from school if the rash is weeping and cannot be covered or until the rash is dry and crusted over.
