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#### **YEAR 4 SWIMMING**

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As part of their PE curriculum, Year 4 children will swimming at Gosforth Pool next week. Because we are going to church on Friday, children will have a longer session on Thursday and will not attend on Friday. Lunch will be taken early on this day, before children leave for swimming.

Gosforth Pool request the following:

- Children with long hair (both boys and girls) should have hair tied back and therefore will need to wear/bring a hair bobble (or put hair inside a swimming cap)
- **All jewellery**, including earrings, and watches should be removed (ideally not worn for school please)
- All items of clothing should be clearly named
- Children can bring a snack for after swimming
- Everyone should have a named water bottle in school to bring to the pool

Class teachers will be in touch with parents confirming parent helpers for each day. Helpers have now received an email.

If you have not yet completed the ParentMail form for swimming, please do so as soon as possible.

WRAPAROUND UPDATE

Following parental feedback, we have reviewed our After School Club menu (please see attached). Now that the weather is improving, we hope to make use of the outdoor area so, if there is a note on the main entrance door to say we are on the field, please collect your child from the side gate (past the kitchen door, next to the green container). Thank you.

A polite reminder that if you do not pick up your child by 3:20pm, your child will automatically be taken to after-school club as classroom staff have to fulfil other duties and attend relevant training which has an impact on the whole school. The charge for After School sessions is currently $\pounds 9$.

FREE SCHOOL MEAL HOLIDAY VOUCHERS

The Easter and May half term holiday FSM voucher payment is £15 per eligible pupil per week. This is less than the last holiday payment of £20. £15 is the amount normally. The Council agreed to push to £20 for the last two winter payments to support the additional pressures with cold weather utilities etc as an exception. Vouchers will be issued as follows:

- £15 per eligible child 26.5.23

FOREST SCHOOL

Mrs Francis led Science Week themed Forest School last week. The children used their senses to explore the soil in our woodland area to learn all about the hidden world of wonderful, working worms. They discovered three different types of worms in our



soil, earth workers, surface dwellers and deep burrowers. They placed the worms in a tray to take a closer look, then placed them all back where we found them so they can keep recycling and making super soil for plants to grow! They also made bird feeders to hang in the trees and toasted hot cross buns on the fire.

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RECEPTION TRANSITION TO YEAR 1

From Monday 24th April, in readiness for moving to Year 1, children in Reception will enter school via the main cloakroom from the yard (where Years 1 and 2 enter) instead of through their classroom door. Reception children should initially



enter at 8:30am please (and will be greeted by Mrs Armstrong) and **Years 1 and 2 can enter after Reception at 8:35am**. Please could we ask children in Years 1 and 2 to stand back to allow Reception to enter first whilst they are getting used to their new routine. After the first few days, when Reception children are comfortable in their new routine, we can resume the usual 10 minute window for all children. Thank you in advance for your understanding.



READING BUDDIES


