SECTION 1: ATTENDANCE

WORKING TOGETHER TO IMPROVE SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

- Good attendance at school is essential for children to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing and wider life chances.
- Nurseries and First Schools play a vital role in embedding good attendance habits.
- Even at First School, children with the highest attainment have higher rates of attendance.
- National data shows us that children not meeting the expected standard in reading, writing and maths had an overall absence rate of 4.7% (so their overall attendance was 95.3%).
- The overall absence rate of children not meeting the expected standard was higher than among those meeting the higher standard (4.7% compared to 2.7%).
- For the most vulnerable pupils, regular attendance is also an important protective factor and the best opportunity for needs to be identified and support provided.
- Research has shown there are clear links between regular absence from school and harm for children (90% of young offenders have been persistently absent as young children) and serious violence (83% of knife possession offenders had been persistently absent for at least one year).

Improving school attendance is everyone's business. Please support us in promoting the benefits of good attendance with your child - not only for their education but, also, to support their wellbeing and future life chances. Thank you.

As you know, there is no entitlement in law to time off in term time. Children who are absent from school fall behind in their learning, they miss school events and many find it difficult to catch up. In addition, school staff have to divert their attention away from other children in order to support those that have fallen behind due to a holiday related absence.

For this reason, any request for leave of absence due to holidays in term time will not be authorised. In the case of all unauthorised leave of absences, incurring 8 or more unauthorised sessions (4 days), an application for a Fixed Penalty Notice will be made to the Local Authority.

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nonsense words they were shown!








EBSNA

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NEW NURSERY WELCOME EVENTS



We can't wait to welcome all of our new Nursery parents to come and look around our provision and hear key messages for the forth coming year on Tuesday 2nd July at 5.30pm. Parents will hear about all of the exciting things their child will do as we welcome them into our Nursery family.

NEW RECEPTION WELCOME EVENTS

Our meeting for children starting Reception is Tuesday 25th June at 5.30pm. Children will then take part in transition days where they will have the chance to meet Mrs Egdell and play in their new classroom. On Wednesday 3rd July, existing Nursery children will spend the morning in their new classroom and in the afternoon children new to our school will visit with their parents. On Thursday 4th July, existing Nursery children and children



new to school will meet each other and have time getting to know one another whilst they play in their new classroom with Mrs Egdell.

INTERNAL TRANSITION

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For children currently in Reception-Year 3, transition activities will take place on 3rd & 4th July. On these days, children in current Reception and Year 1 should enter school via their usual door (KS1 cloakroom) and children in current Year 2 and 3 should enter via the KS2 cloakroom door (next to the field).



Children will spend two full days in their new class with their new class teacher and support staff. There will also be an opportunity for parents and carers to meet with new class teachers (please see dates attached). Please complete the ParentMail form to let us know if you are able to attend. YEAR 4 LEAVERS EVENTS

Staff from GCMS have now visited school several times to meet our Year 4 children. They observed children learning with Mrs Singh and GCMS staff have led lessons. A group of Year 5 pupils visited Year 4 and delivered a Spanish presentation. Some of our children have undertaken visits in small groups and fed back to their peers. Mrs Singh has met with the head of Year 5 and the SENCo at GCMS to share relevant information about transition.

The SEMH team will be working with a small group of children, in school, in preparation for transition (relevant parents have been informed via email).

SEND reviews for children in our current Year 4 class will take place on Wednesday 26th June (please sign up via ParentMail). These will be attended by Mrs Singh and the SENCo from GCMS. Mrs Singh will be in touch with parents and carers of children who are transferring to different schools to arrange a time to meet before the end of term.

Children who are transferring to our feeder middle school, Gosforth Central (GCMS), should come to school as normal, via the KS2 cloakroom door, on both transition days (Wednesday 3rd & Thursday 4th July) and a member of our staff will walk them to GCMS at 9:00am to begin their transition days. They will be collected at 2:45pm and dismissed, as usual, from ARFS via the Year 4 cloakroom door on both days.

Moving to

Children transferring to other middle schools will need to be dropped off and collected by parents and carers, please.

All children in transition years from Church of England Schools in our Diocese were invited to attend the Leavers Service at Newcastle Cathedral yesterday. This was an opportunity for children to reflect upon their time in at our school and think about their next steps as part of our wider Diocesan family of schools. It was a beautiful service and everyone came away feeling very grateful to be part of the Diocesan family of schools.

Additionally, Year 4 will be holding their Year 4 Leavers' Service in school on Friday 19th July at 9:15pm and parents and carers are warmly invited to attend. Tea and coffee will be provided. As always, bring your tissues, as it is sure to be an emotional event!

All Saints' Church are in the process of arranging a Leavers Party (invitation and consent form to follow). The event is planned to run after the music concert so our Year 4 children will already be at the church and, those with consent, will be handed over to All Saints' staff to attend the party. Children without consent will return to school. Registration of those attending will take place in the church building following the concert.

UNIFORM UPDATE

From September, only children in Years 2, 3 and 4 will wear the navy PE uniform. Children in Year 1 will still come to school in PE kit, but this will consist of the usual yellow polo shirt and blue school jumper rather than the navy hoodie. Eventually, the aim is to phase out the navy PE kit in order to reduce costs to parents by only requiring one uniform for the full week.

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

Children & Families Newcastle is part of a community network providing activities and services across four localities in the city for babies, children, young people and families. We are part of the North Community Hub. Community hubs link to other buildings in the locality to create a network of venues that offer activities and services.
