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

When are the MMR

When are the MMR vaccinations usually given? The best times are between 12 and 13 months of age and again at three years and four months, with one dose on each occasion. But, if your child wasn't vaccinated then, they can be uscinated at our one with them vaccinated at any age with two doses one month apart.

Your child may get the symptoms of measles, mumps and rubella for up to six weeks after the vaccination but in a very much milder form. This proves that the vaccine is working and your child is building up resistance to future contact with the viruses that cause the three diseases. Not all children show these symptoms but that doesn't mean the vaccine isn't working. Should parents in outbreak

measles? As with many diseases, once you have had measles, you don't catch it again because you have built up a natural resistance to it. So, if you've had measles two doses of MMR

vaccine you do not need to get vaccinated now.



In the near future you will be making decisions about the next stage of your child's education. This term the Local Education Authority will provide you with information about the schools in Newcastle and you will be asked to make a choice.

For some parents that decision may be very straightforward. You may already have a son or daughter attending a middle school and you would wish this pattern of schooling to be continued. For other parents your child currently in Year 4 may be your oldest or only child. In this case it is possible that you have had little contact with our school and may be uncertain as to what decision vou should make.

To help parents who have little first-hand knowledge of our school, we are providing the opportunity to visit Gosforth Central Middle School on Thursday 10th October 2019 6.00 pm -8.00 pm. During this evening, you and your child will be able to meet the staff, tour the school and experience some of the learning activities on offer in year 5 and beyond.

Even if you do know the school well, this is still a good opportunity to visit so that your child has an early view of middle school. All parents whose children gain a place will have the opportunity to visit the school in early July and children will spend a full transition day with us in their last term of Year 4 before transferring to Year 5 in September 2020.

We very much look forward to welcoming you and your child soon.
