May we also politely remind families that attend of some of our expectations that they consented to via ParentMail, and, additionally, ask that families do not allow siblings in the space where your child is participating, particularly younger siblings:

Expectations of parents/ carers:

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- ensure appropriate clothing is worn by the pupil at all times.
- webcams must be kept on at all times to ensure that their child is the person in the session.
- agreed working space must be approved by the parent/ carer before each session. This should be conducive to learning and should not reveal any personal information (ideally the background should be a blank wall)
- there must be no other screens on in the visible background
- not record the session or share the session with any one whatsoever under any circumstances.
- the **parent/ carer must be within earshot of the lesson** and always aware that the session is taking place, so that they may intervene, especially if their child is about to say or do something inappropriate for the session.
- some children may need the person in the room to help keep them focused and safe, particularly if it is a new activity.
- only your child, not any members of their family, may participate any queries for teachers should be placed via email and any work should be shared through Tapestry, not these meetings.

For these sessions to go ahead, it is absolutely essential that these expectations are met as we have a duty of care for all children within the catch up. Thank you for your understanding.

Full Reopening of School

As you will no doubt be aware, the Prime Minister has indicated that schools may fully reopen from 8th March. We will, of course, keep you up to date with information as we receive it. We are really hopeful that this will happen as soon as possible.

RESIDENTIAL

Unfortunately, we have been forced to cancel Year 4's residential for this year. Given current restrictions, we would not be able to go on our date in April. We asked about the possibility of pushing it back later in the summer term before the children left Archbishop Runcie but Dukeshouse Wood had no availability. We are absolutely heartbroken that we cannot go. We will issue refunds to parents for their deposits after half-term.
