SECTION 1: ATTENDANCE

WORKING TOGETHER TO IMPROVE SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

- Good attendance at school is essential for children to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing and wider life chances.
- Nurseries and first schools play a vital role in embedding good attendance habits.
- Even at first school, children with the highest attainment have higher rates of attendance compared to those with the lowest attainment.
- National data shows us that children not meeting the expected standard in reading, writing and maths also had lower attendance.
- For the most vulnerable pupils, regular attendance is also an important protective factor and the best opportunity for needs to be identified and support provided. Research has shown there are clear links between regular absence from school and harm for children.

Improving school attendance is everyone’s business. Please support us in promoting the benefits of good attendance with your child - not only for their education but, also, to support their wellbeing and future life chances. Thank you.

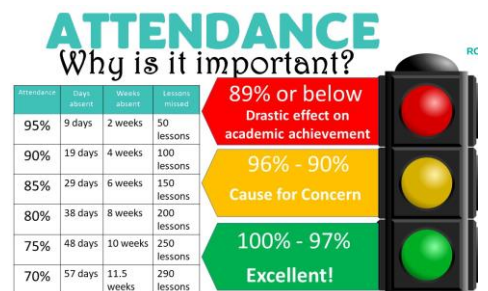

Did you know ...?

- 95% attendance = two weeks absence
- 90% attendance = 4 weeks absence
- 85% attendance = 6 weeks absence
- 80% attendance = more than half a term of absence
- 75% attendance = more than 9 weeks of absence

Please remember that I am unable to authorise absences during term time for family holidays. We would be grateful if parents/carers could also inform grandparents, family and friends, who may be looking to book birthday or Christmas trips away, that these do not fall under exceptional circumstances and will not be authorised.



If you need any support regarding attendance, please do not hesitate to come and speak to us as we can help you access support from the school nurse, attendance officer or other appropriate services.

We recognise that children may have a legitimate reason to be absent from school, and we are also aware that some families face difficulties which may impact on their child's education, therefore, the traffic light system has been put in place to support families by highlighting concerns at an early stage.



We hope that you will continue to support our school by promoting school attendance and by informing us if you feel there are any issues that are preventing your child from attending school regularly.

EDUCATIONAL VISITS

As you know, we place a huge curricular emphasis on educational visits to supplement children's in-school learning. These visits are planned into our curriculum and mapped across the school to ensure children get a range of educational experiences during their time at ARFS. The school budget is not able to cover these costs so we routinely ask parents and carers to make a financial contribution to these. This year, educational visits have cost our school £12,150 and we have only received £8,481 in parental contributions meaning the school budget is covering the £3,669 shortfall.



All schools are facing significant budget cuts and we are, therefore, unable to sustain this level of financial contribution. As a result, we are reminding parents about the importance of these experiences and that if insufficient donations are made, we will regretfully have to cancel visits.

We have, over the past few years, used Pupil Premium funding that the school receives to fund these experiences for children in receipt of Pupil Premium funding. Unfortunately, next financial year, Pupil Premium funding will be used for in-school support and resources rather than educational visits.

This year, in response to feedback, Mrs Coates has offered regular instalments to cover costs of visits so we can avoid pinch-points for parents. If you have not yet paid for your child(ren)'s visits via ParentMail, please do so as soon as you are able to.

If any families are facing financial hardship, we would invite you to contact Mrs Lowe who will look at options to support your individual circumstances. Many thanks for your understanding.

NURSERY 30 HOUR PLACES

Childcare Applying for 30 hours free childcare Choices through the childcare service

-  Apply through the childcare service: <https://www.childcarechoices.gov.uk/>
You will need to confirm your identity.
-  If successful you will receive an eligibility code – '50xxxxxxx'
-  Take this code to your childcare provider with your NI number, child's date of birth and complete a Parent Declaration form.
-  Your childcare provider checks the code is valid – and if valid - confirms when you can start and reminds you to **reconfirm – every 3 months**
-  Every three months, reconfirm your eligibility through the childcare service (helpline below)

Your 30-hour eligibility code has a validity end date.
If you fail to reconfirm or become ineligible, you will stop receiving the extra hours. If you are unsure discuss with your provider immediately. This is your responsibility.
