HAPPY NEW YEAR!

I hope you all had a safe and restful Christmas holiday with your families and those of you who were unwell are recovering. The children have returned to school refreshed and eager to learn. We have talked about making New Year's resolutions linked to our school values of love and determination — please ask your child to share theirs at home too!

Teachers have planned stimulating and challenging learning opportunities for our children, across the curriculum, and our priority is to be able to continue face-to-face learning with as many children as possible so that we minimise disruption to their learning. Last week, each class teacher wrote to parents and carers with details of curriculum plans and how to support children at home.

We have already seen that the new Omicron variant of covid-19 is adding disruption for many families and to our staffing levels at school.



We will continue to do our best to minimise risks while making school feel as happy and 'normal' as possible. We know that you will all share this priority and will continue to support us by following the relevant guidance and working with us to keep everything running smoothly.

I hope you all enjoyed Nativities via the links we send home before Christmas. May I express a huge thanks to GEM Education for recording these and preparing them for parents to view within such a short timescale (alongside all the other schools they were serving!). Thank you for the positive feedback that we have received from many parents. We are delighted you enjoyed them and so pleased that we were able to give children at ARFS this opportunity. We can remember it as 'the year we tried to make Christmas as typical as possible...!'. These links will expire in the next few days so, if you have not already downloaded a copy, please ensure you do!

COVID UPDATE

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As you will know, the covid guidance seems to be ever changing!

Last night, I informed relevant parents of a positive case in Year 3 and After School Club and the appropriate isolation times under current DfE guidance. We have subsequently been informed of a further positive case within Year 3. In addition, there has been a positive case within Nursery earlier in the week.



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This means that these children are considered close contacts and are strongly advised to begin daily LFD testing for 7 days after the last contact with the confirmed case:

- Year 3 and some children in After School Club should test until Thursday 20th January.
- Nursery children should test until Tuesday 18th January.

If there are further cases in these groups, the end date for testing could be extended again, but we will keep in touch and inform you if we know this to be the case.

A reminder that primary school age should follow the 7 day LFD testing guidance after being identified as a close contact. The DfE has stated that this should include Nursery and Reception children at parents/carers' discretion. We strongly recommend that parents and carers of Nursery and Reception children follow this advice, as it contributes towards minimising transmission to other children, families and school staff. Please don't wait for Test and Trace to contact you to tell you that your child is a close contact!

Please contact us if you have any questions, if your child tests positive on a LFD test or if your child develops symptoms (in which case you are advised to book a PCR test).

We hope that everyone who is unwell has mild symptoms and gets better quickly. Thank you again for your support.

SYMPTOMS & POSITIVE TESTS

- Children and adults with new symptoms should self-isolate and book a PCR test as soon as possible
- If a PCR test returns a positive result, the affected person must then follow the self-isolation guidance from NHS Test and Trace. This should tell you when your self-isolation ends.
- Currently (until Monday!), if you have a positive result and are self-isolating, from day 6 onwards
 of your self-isolation, you should take an LFD test (rapid home test). If you have two consecutive
 negative results 24 hours apart, your self-isolation can end the day after the second negative result.
 So, if you have a negative result on day 6 and on day 7, day 7 becomes your last day of isolation.

If you have a positive result on day 6, but a negative result on day 7 and on day 8, day 8 becomes your last day of isolation, etc. If you continue to have positive results up to day 10, day 10 still remains your last day of isolation, as it is very unlikely that will you will be infectious after 10 days. If you still have symptoms, you may have to prolong your self-isolation. If you cannot carry out LFD tests, then you must also complete the full 10 days of self-isolation.

- For positive results, if you use an LFD test on day 6 (the earliest which you should) and then 24 hrs later on day 7 and they are BOTH negative, your self-isolation stops after that test. So, if children have an LFD test with a negative result on the morning of day 6 and the morning of day 7 (they must be 24 hours apart), they can return to school after the test on day 7. The same would apply to day 7 and 8 or day 8 and 9. If you find yourself in this position and you are not sure, give us a ring and we will advise.
- Please continue to inform school of all positive test results, even though you no longer need a
 confirmation PCR, and please continue to get in touch with any questions or if you need any
 advice. Thank you.
- The DfE have updated its Actions for Schools guidance (Schools COVID-19 operational guidance January 2022 (publishing.service.gov.uk) to link to the updated public health guidance Stay at home: guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection GOV.UK (www.gov.uk).



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From Monday 17 January, people who are self-isolating with COVID-19 will have the option, if they have no symptoms, to reduce their isolation period after 5 full days if they test negative with a lateral flow device (LFD) test on both day 5 and day 6 and they do not have a temperature. For example, if they test negative on the morning of day 5 and the morning of day 6, they can return to their education or childcare setting immediately on day 6.

The first test must be taken no earlier than day 5 of the self-isolation period, and the second must be taken the following day. All test results should be <u>reported to NHS Test and Trace</u>.

If the result of either of their tests is positive, they should continue to self-isolate until they get negative results from two LFD tests on consecutive days or until they have completed 10 full days of self-isolation, whichever is earliest.

Anyone who is unable to take LFD tests or anyone who continues to have a temperature will need to complete the full 10 day period of self-isolation.

Further information on self-isolation for those with COVID-19 is available.

CLOSE CONTACTS

• If you are a fully vaccinated adult or a child attending a childcare or education setting, and you are a close contact of someone who tests positive for Covid 19, you do not have to book a PCR anymore. Instead, you should begin daily LFD tests (rapid home tests) for 7 days following the last contact. During



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this time, it would be wise to be cautious and reduce contacts with others where possible, but you can still attend school or work. If you develop any symptoms or have a positive result from an LFD, you should begin self-isolation and book a PCR.

- It has been confirmed in the DfE update for schools that children under 5 are included in this part of the guidance 'at parental or guardian discretion'. LFD test kits are available through the usual routes (community test sites, local pharmacies or online) for children who are 5 years old and over.
- For adults who are not fully vaccinated, you still need to book a PCR rather than using daily tests.



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MITIGATIONS IN SCHOOL:

- All adults will wear face coverings/masks in school. These may be removed for teaching or when communication is difficult.
- We will continue to ventilate rooms by opening windows and doors – this means that the building will be cold so please feel free to send in extra layers.
- We will continue with frequent handwashing and sanitising.
- We will continue to keep frequently touched surfaces as clean as possible.
- We will reduce indoor mixing of classes to what is essential, e.g. lunchtimes in the hall, and these occasions will be managed as safely as possible.
- We will continue to lead collective worship with only two classes who are distanced.
- We will continue to send home any children who are unwell or have symptoms which may be indicative of a Covid infection.
- We will continue to inform parents and carers of the number of cases in school and which classes are affected.
- We will review numbers each day and week and will keep all of our mitigations under constant review.
- We will also continue to work closely with the LA and our local Public Health Team in order to guide our decision making.

Please continue to ring us if you have any questions or if you are in any doubt about whether your child should attend school. Thank you yet again for your ongoing support.


VOLUNTEERS NEEDED PLEASE!
