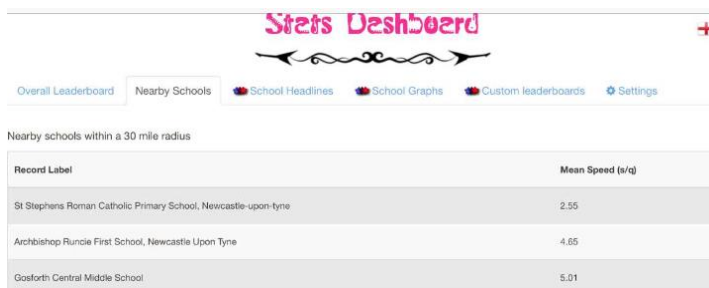


### OH NO, IT'S A GRUFFALO!

Staffing in Year 1	Miss Wilkinson has been appointed to cover Year 1.	Continuity for children.
Peer Reading Buddies (across Key Stages) where older children listen to younger children and vice versa.	Staff have discussed this suggestion and we intend to implement this system later this term.	Children read aloud to a peer reading "buddy" which helps younger children aspire to read well and enables all children to develop their reading abilities and will foster a sense of community.
Costs of activities	We are aware that we have asked for more contributions than usual, however, we believe the impact of the visits and visitors has been significant, enabling children to make an excellent start to the year. We will continue to consider costs when planning activities in future.	Visits and visitors have supported an energetic start to the year where children have been engaged in their learning. We will consider frequency of these events in future.
More team sports as after school clubs/after school clubs for Reception	We will consider this when planning extra-curricular activities in future.	Engagement of a wider group of pupils.
Current level of Homework	Whilst homework came out of feedback as a <i>common strength</i> , two parents this as being unwelcome. Please remember that although homework is strongly encouraged it is not statutory. Homework was also mentioned many times as an improvement since September.

### SCHOOL DINNER PAYMENTS

Nursery only (£1.90 per day)	Amount Due
If your child is full time	£66.50
If you child stays for lunch for 2 days per week	£26.60

Please calculate the amount owing if your child has a different attendance pattern.

Year 3 and 4 lunch register accounts are now up to date, as of today, with meals taken and amounts owing. For Year 4, this also takes into account any credits/debits from last year.

Years 3 & 4 only (£2.00 per day)	Amount Due
If your account is balanced (at £0), as at today and you are paying until Christmas	£50
If you are paying for this half term in full (5.11.18-Christmas, taking into account the Discovery Museum visit)	£68

If you have a debt/credit on your account, you can calculate payment accordingly. If you have not paid for your child's dinner last term (by cash or cheque), this debt will be shown on your current ParentMail balance so you can make payment via ParentMail.

All Lunch Registers will be updated daily going forward so you can keep track of your child's balance. It is preferred that payment is made for the remainder of the term in full but you may make payments weekly on Monday for the week ahead. Any credits on accounts (for absence or overpayment) will be refunded at the end of the school year (unless requested earlier).

### **PARENTMAIL PAYMENTS**

If you are unable to make payment online, there are in fact two ways of making payment at a PayPoint retailer with cash.

- PayCash is the preferred option. This allows parents to generate a barcode for any or all of the payment items they would like to purchase on ParentMail. This is selected by you when checking out and generates a barcode which you can either print, or show on your mobile phone, and pay for at a PayPoint retailer with cash.
- PayPoint is for parents who do not have easy access to a computer or the internet and therefore need to have a method of making payments offline. School has to generate a barcode for each single item, which can be sent to you by email or can be printed and put in your child book bags. You can then take this barcode to a PayPoint retailer to make the payment with cash. There are minimum payments for PayCash (£2.50) and PayPoint (£5). Please advise Mrs McCloud if she needs to do this for you.

Payment reminders have been sent to parents who have not paid for previous events or trips. In future, we will have to cancel events or trips if sufficient contributions are not made. If you are unable to contribute and your child qualifies for Pupil Premium funding we can make the payment on your behalf.
