School Update

Our new caretaker Mr. Russell Hunter has settled very well indeed and has mentioned how welcoming the children and parents of our school are. He has already demonstrated that he will be a real asset, ensuring the school is operating smoothly and identifying areas which he would like to develop in the future. For safeguarding purposes he will lock the car park gates between the hours of 8.15-9.00a.m and 3.00-3.45p.m. At 9.00a.m and 3.45p.m once he has unlocked the car park gates he will then lock the gates from the playground area to ensure the safety of our children.

Home school partnership

Thank you to all parents who were able to attend the meeting on Monday 30th April at 2.00p.m to explore home school partnership and homework. It was really useful with many ideas provided. The staff are also considering home/school partnership and homework and we will be discussing homework with the children too. We will analyse the ideas to identify common themes and then consult further with parents. Thank you to those parents who could not attend the meeting but forwarded an e-mail instead. If anybody does wish to forward suggestions regarding home/school communication or homework please feel free to do so.

Lunchtimes

Thank you for your time adjusting to the new dinner procedures and processes. This is having a significant impact upon the efficiency of the office so it is greatly appreciated. Some parents have spoken to me regarding paying for the same days each week for the half term in advance. I am sorry after discussing this with Mrs McCloud we feel it is important to come in line with the Gosforth Schools Trust and it would have the added complication of different amounts of money being collected each day.

I would like to reassure parents that Mrs Battista adapts the menus according to the likes/dislikes of the children. For example if one of the two choices on offer is not popular she will make sure the other choice is one of the children's favourite meals. For example on Fishy Friday she also served tortilla pizza wraps which are very popular. Alongside the two choices there is also a selection of bread and a salad bar available each day so if the children did not like any of the dishes Mrs Battista would make them a sandwich to have with the rest of their hot meal. She is very happy to speak to individual parents who have any concerns so please feel free to pop into see her or if you come to see me then I will ask her any questions you may have.

If you have not paid for school meals yet this half term, please would you kindly do so (£56 taking into account the bank holiday and teacher training day). Mrs McCloud is still updating the ParentMail system and will send a ParentMail to you when the balances reported to you can be accurately relied upon.
