SECTION 1: ATTENDANCE

WORKING TOGETHER TO IMPROVE SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

- Good attendance at school is essential for children to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing and wider life chances.
- Nurseries and first schools play a vital role in embedding good attendance habits.
- Even at first school, children with the highest attainment have higher rates of attendance compared to those with the lowest attainment.
- National data shows us that children not meeting the expected standard in reading, writing and maths also had lower attendance.
- For the most vulnerable pupils, regular attendance is also an important protective factor and the best opportunity for needs to be identified and support provided. Research has shown there are clear links between regular absence from school and harm for children.

Improving school attendance is everyone's business. Please support us in promoting the benefits of good attendance with your child - not only for their education but, also, to support their wellbeing and future life chances. Thank you.

Did you know ...?

- \cdot 95% attendance = two weeks absence
- \cdot 90% attendance = 4 weeks absence
- \cdot 85% attendance = 6 weeks absence
- \cdot 80% attendance = more than half a term of absence
- \cdot 75% attendance = more than 9 weeks of absence

parents/carers could also inform grandparents, family and friends, who may be looking to book birthday or Christmas trips away, that these do not fall under exceptional circumstances and will not be authorised.



If you need any support regarding attendance, please do not hesitate to come and speak to us as we can help you access support from the school nurse, attendance officer or other appropriate services.

We recognise that children may have a legitimate reason to be absent from school, and we are also aware that some families face difficulties which may impact on their child's education, therefore, the traffic light system has been put in place to support families by highlighting concerns at an early stage.

We hope that you will continue to support our school by promoting school

attendance and by informing us if you feel there are any issues that are preventing your child from attending school regularly.

SAFER INTERNET DAY

On Tuesday the 11th of February, KS1 and KS2 pupils all had the opportunity to attend workshops by GEM education to highlight the importance of Safer internet day. As a school, we take internet safety very seriously and the children were given opportunities to spot scams, seek advice from appropriate bodies and

use different apps on the iPads to create information packs for other children. We also reiterated that any concerns or worries about being online should be reported to a trusted adult, Childline or CEOP.

1 MINUTE MATHS

We are excited to share that White Rose Maths Hub have created a new app that will support our children in their Maths fluency. The app is called 1-Minute Maths and is free to download. It promotes fluency in subitising, addition, subtraction, multiplication and division and is suitable for all age ranges within our school. Quick recall and fluency in

these areas are key to developing further mathematical skills such as problem solving and reasoning and it will be particularly useful for our Year 4 pupils who will take their Multiplication Tables Check in June.



DANCE FESTIVAL

We have signed up to take part in the local authority Dance Festival at Whitley Bay playhouse in April. Mrs Francis has consulted with Years 3 & 4 and selected children to take part (parents/carers of relevant children have been informed via ParentMail). These children will attend weekly rehearsals every Thursday 3:15-4:15pm in advance of their performance.
